The music of award-winning American composer Greg Bartholomew is frequently performed across the United States and in Canada, Europe and Australia. NPR classical music reviewer Tom Manoff called Bartholomew "a fine composer not afraid of accessibility."

Born in St. Paul, Minnesota, in 1957, Bartholomew studied trombone at Seattle's John Muir Elementary School and piano at Cornish College of the Arts before earning degrees from the College of William & Mary in Virginia and the University of Washington. He sang with Seattle Pro Musica for more than fifteen years and studied violin with Teo Benson. He currently studies trumpet with Judson Scott. A two-time Finalist for the American Prize in Choral Composition (2012 and 2013), Bartholomew was the 2012/2013 Composer in Residence for the Cascadian Chorale.

Sheet music for his works is available from ART OF SOUND MUSIC, ARS NOVA PRESS, IMAGINE MUSIC, ORPHEUS MUSIC, J.W.PEPPER and SHEET MUSIC PLUS. He has received support from Meet the Composer and the American Music Center, as well as annual ASCAP Standard Awards since 2003. He is a member of the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP), the Society of Composers, Inc., and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia.
